

Heads Up Dog Training

Presents a 3 Day Field camp with Anne Everett Handling for Success at Tests and Trials

July 31-Aug 2, 2010

This workshop is unique in that it focuses on training YOU the Handler. It will cover the techniques and training that you require to handle your dog successfully at all levels in hunt test and working certificate competition. If you are planning to make the big jump from Junior to Senior/Master, if your dog is consistently failing tests and you are not sure why, if you want to improve your handling skills, this workshop is for you.

Topics covered include: analyzing a test, developing a plan for successfully running a test with your dog, mental preparation for competition, handling for maximum success on blinds (how to recognize hazards and how to deal with them), what to do if you and your dog get into trouble, when to handle on marks, how judges evaluate dog work in tests, how to run effective training sessions, how to use attrition successfully in your training program, how to distinguish between lack of effort and compliance errors.

The classroom session includes a power point presentation, handouts, demonstrations and diagrams. Field sessions will consist of test set-ups that each participant will evaluate and run with either their own dog or a fully trained Master dog, under the supervision of the instructor. Participant's dogs are welcome. Participant dogs must have a force retrieve and be doing at least WCX or Senior level blinds. No exceptions. E-collars are permitted, however dogs must be conditioned to their use before attending the workshop. E-collar conditioning procedures will not be covered in this workshop. Each handler will be video taped during their time on line. Footage will be shot from the line, as well as from out in the field giving you the dog's point of view. Tapes will be viewed and feedback given at regular times throughout the three days.

Anne Everett has been involved with the CKC hunt test program since its inception. She is qualified to judge at all levels of hunt tests, field trials, as well as HRC hunts. Anne has earned over 100 Master passes on 12 different dogs, 6 UKC HRCH's, and 6 UKC UH's. She has also earned Qualifying wins, as well as Open and Junior field trial placements with her dogs. She has titled 4 Grand Master Hunters in Canada, as well as 10 Master Hunters and a number of Junior and Senior dogs. Anne has also earned CKC OTCH titles on two dogs and has numerous High in Trials in the obedience ring. She earned the first OTCH-MH title combination on a Golden Retriever in Canada.

The workshop will be held at Heads Up Kennels in Merville, BC on July 31-Aug 2. The classroom session will be on Saturday morning; the remainder of the three days will be spent in the field. Participants will be limited to 15 working handlers. 2 dog per handler limit. The cost for the workshop is \$300 for a working spot. Registration closes when the workshop fills. No refunds after July 1. Information on local accommodation and directions to the workshop will be sent out with your confirmation of registration.

This is a working clinic. Bring your dog, lunch, a chair, a walkie-talkie, an umbrella, and shade for your dog. Parking and airing areas will be available on the kennel grounds.
